## Microjustice4ALL

Microjustice4All (MJ4All) works to legally empower the poorest and most marginalized people around the world. Over the past twenty-two years, MJ4All has developed a legal service provision methodology in Europe, South America and Africa to increase legal inclusion in the context of humanitarian crises and global development. As of 2018, MJ4All began its first Legal Inclusion Mapping Programs in Bolivia, Kenya, and Serbia. It will soon start its Mappings in Egypt and Jordan as well.


At MJ4All, our understanding of legal inclusion is focused on the practicalities of everyday life. Our aim is to ensure that basic legal needs are satisfied to help provide individuals with legal protection and access to entitlements such as public services, benefits and amenities. In particular, MJ4All focuses on non-litigious private and administrative legal matters that are fundamental for legal inclusion.

UN Global Goal for Sustainable Development 16 offers an opportunity to enhance legal empowerment activities worldwide as it puts 'Legal Inclusion' as a goal on the international agenda. Legal inclusion requires well-focused legal empowerment work in which all stakeholders join forces. This is the reason MJ4All has developed an operational framework for implementation of Global Goal 16 with the Country-Specific, Action-Oriented Legal Inclusion Mapping Program.

### The Legal Inclusion Mapping Framework to Reach UN Global Goal 16

The purpose of the Legal Inclusion Mapping Program is to implement Global Goal 16. The Mapping Program is built on two pillars:

- **The mapping** a) categorizes a country based on the extent of its legal inclusion/exclusion and b) identifies the country's marginalized groups as well as the needs for their legal empowerment, pointing to solutions.
- **The Comprehensive Legal Empowerment Plan to Achieve Legal Inclusion.** It is a solution-based program, involving all stakeholders, that takes the results of the Mapping's analysis to implement sustainable and inclusive solutions to meet marginalized groups' legal needs. It has a **Progress Monitoring Framework on Global Goal 16** embedded within it to measure progress vis-à-vis the baseline established by the Mapping.



The Mapping can be seen as an audit into the state of legal inclusion of a country. The Mapping Method makes use of indicators to assess the ability to contribute to legal inclusion of the 3 actors in legal interactions: the People, the State and Legal Services.
